Shirebrook Refurbishment Update

We have been talking about refurbishing the Shirebrook office for a number of years so I think Jackie was a little shocked when we eventually confirmed in May that we would be starting. Once the works at Bingham were complete, the builders decamped upto Shirebrook where we had decided we could do the job in two halves and maintain a functioning office for the duration.

As usual, if we do a job then we do it properly and these works are far more than just a lick of paint. As you can see from the plans (on page two) not many rooms will serve the same purpose at the end of the works and the changes include a new office at the front of the building, new client toilet off reception, larger mortuary and larger cold room, proper kitchen and area for drivers and our preferred waiting room / chapel set up. To achieve all this, we are moving walls and doors, installing a new shop front, putting steels in, taking up floors and of course the usual finishing touches to give the fresh but traditional look of a Lymn's funeral home.

Currently the project is about 50% complete. The office, reception, bathroom, and kitchen are now complete, decorated and Jackie moved into her new office last week. The builders have moved into the rest of the building to complete the works on the arranging room, chapels, cold room and mortuary. Thanks to the maintenance team and particularly Artur who has done all the suspended ceilings and decorating to a high standard. Jackie has been very patient throughout and it mainly seen chasing the builders round with the hoover and a duster!








The Ashes Register

We are pleased to be the first funeral director in the UK to address the lack of formal regulation of uncollected ashes in the industry – by creating a record on an online public register.

We have uploaded information of all cremated remains in our possession since before 2000 to 'The Ashes Register', a new initiative designed to map the location of ashes.

A total of 136 ashes have been uploaded to the online database by us, with the oldest dating back to 1952. Amongst this list also includes decorated veteran, Air Commodore George Lawson CBE MC.

Uncollected ashes have been a long standing challenge in the funeral industry, with an estimated hundreds of thousands of unclaimed urns sitting in funeral homes across the UK, some of which date back to the 19th century.

The Ashes Register is a new online initiative, set up by founder Richard Martin. It's a free service available to the public to register a set of ashes and mark the location of where they were scattered. The option to find lost ashes is a new element to the website, which we are the first funeral directors to use.

On working with us to bring this new service to the public, Richard said: "Our goal is simple and it's to reunite as

many people as possible with the ashes of a relative or loved one. We feel so passionate about history not being lost in time, which is why we set up this website to provide a space for people to document someone's final resting place.

"We have received lots of support from leading companies and organisations in the cremation sector on the Ashes Register but A.W. Lymn is the first funeral directors to step forward and be involved in the unclaimed ashes section of the website. They are really paving the way in the industry and we hope this is the start of other funeral directors following suit."

Dion Stray Driver / Bearer, Mansfield


'My name is Dion, I am 54 years old and I live in Mansfield.

Over the coming weeks we will be re-naming the business from Chase & District to Hammerwich Crematorium & Cemetery.

"My name is James Shelley, I started working at Chase & District Memorial Park in July 2012 when it was still an empty field. Originally, I was dumper driving as a site labourer, digging out the roads and paths. I passed my Gravedigging course shortly after and progressed to a supervisory role.

During this time, we planted out all the trees and shrubs and installed the infrastructure as per the landscaping plan. In March 2014 I became the manager.

In May 2018, we started building the crematorium in the existing building as I trained to be a crematorium operator and manager at Stafford Crematorium. But due to complications, we were unable to open, which forced us to build a whole new building just to house the cremator (as it is today) which finally opened its doors in August 2022.

I've played a part in every step of the evolution of this site since the very beginning and I'm immensely proud of what we've achieved this far, and what is still yet to be achieved in the future under the A.W. Lymn family group."

"My name is Moira Tunnicliffe, and I am the General Manager at Chase and District, with over 24 years of experience in the funeral industry, primarily as a Funeral Director.

My journey began at 16 when I worked as a Bereavement Officer at Good Hope Hospital. My passion for becoming a Funeral Director led me to join Dignity as an arranger, and later, I joined Midcounties Cooperative Funeral Care as a funeral operative.

In 2011, I earned my Funeral Directing Diploma and a Diploma in Therapeutic Counselling. 
The event was well attended by members of the public and members of the Mansfield and Hucknall team.
